

### What is the TIP?

- Five-year capital plan for transportation projects
  - Updated annually
  - New projects solicited annually
- Near-term realization of LRTP goals
  - Evaluation criteria defined by the LRTP
- Compiled into a statewide plan at MassDOT





# **TIP Investment Program Goals**









Six goal areas in MPO Project Development

- Equity
- Safety
- Mobility and Reliability
- Access and Connectivity
- Resilience
- Clean Air and Healthy Communities
- TIP has six discrete investment programs that fund a variety of project types

# Eligible Project Types: Near Term

### "Quick Builds"

- Community Connections
  - Bicycle Lanes
  - Bicycle Racks
  - Bikeshare (Expansion, Replacement)
  - Microtransit Pilots
  - Wayfinding Signage
- Transit Transformation
  - Transit Signal Priority



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# **Application Requirements**

- Transit Transformation/Community Connections
  - No written prerequisites
  - Confer with stakeholders in advance (e.g., MBTA)
- Core Programs: Project Design Pilot
  - Project Initiation, written acknowledgement
  - New design only, federal funds in use
- Core Programs: Construction
  - Strongly prioritize 25% Design submitted to MassDOT
  - Very limited exceptions



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# **Application Process**

- Online survey portal through Qualtrics
  - Unified "Core Programs" form for both construction and design
  - Separate Community Connections form
  - Scorecards and links are on the TIP Development website

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# **Post-Application Actions**

- Should receive a confirmation email
  - Email MPO staff if you have questions, want to confirm your submission, or attach more files
- Add additional information as necessary
  - For certain projects, staff may follow up with additional questions
  - You can add letters of support over time; no need to frontload all information
- MPO staff will notify MassDOT with a list of received projects
  - Recommend the municipality notifies separately





## **Prerequisites**

- Project is listed in MaPIT
- Project has reached 25% design
  - Community Connections and Transit Transformation exempt
  - Design Pilot requires MaPIT only
- If you're unsure, talk to us
  - If you want to go for design funding, reach out to MassDOT as well!

#### Transportation Equity

Goal: Facilitate an inclusive and transparent transportation-planning process and make investre that eliminate transportation-related disparities borne by people in disadvantaged communities.



An equity multiplier is applied to criteria that the MPO has identified through public outreach and data analysis as critical transportation needs or where there exist disparities that negatively impact equity populations. These criteria are denoted by a check mark on the right side of this scorecard. Each project's multiplier is based on the percent of the population in the project area that belongs to each of the MPO's six equity populations in the project area relative to their region wide averages. The higher the share of equity populations in the project area, the higher the multiplier

To calculate a final Transportation Equity score, a project's raw equity multiplier is scaled to 20 points and ther added to the base score (out of 80 possible points) as shown at the bottom of this scorecard.

Goal: Achieve zero transportation-related fatalities and serious injuries and improve safety for all users of the transportation system.
